


Tenacres First School – Year 4 Curriculum Information for Parents

We're so proud of how the Year 4 children have returned to school. They have settled in well and we are getting to know each other more. Our first topic is 'Global Guardians' where the children will focus on some topical issues that we face on Earth, including Pollution, Sustainability, and Refugees. How you can help your child:

- Encourage regular reading
- Listen to your child read. Ask questions about what they've read and get them to explain the text. Even fluent readers benefit greatly from reading out loud!
- Don't forget to record reading in your child's home-school diary!
- Practise mental maths – quick fire questions on all topics.
- Practise times tables- chanting the tables, quickfire questions and using TT Rockstars website. All children will sit a compulsory times table check at the end of Year 4.
- Ensure homework is returned.
- Provide suitable P.E. kit and Forest School kit, especially outdoor clothing for warmth.

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English

-use relevant strategies to build their vocabulary composing and rehearsing sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures

- Describe characters, setting and plot, with some interesting details

Use expanded noun phrases and adverbial phrases to expand sentences

-spell words that are often misspelt (common exception words)

-Use sentence demarcation with accuracy, including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks



Maths

-recognise the place value of each digit in a four-digit number (up to 10000)

- Compare and order numbers to 10000.

-find 1,000 more or less than a given number

-round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1,000

-Count in 1000s

-solve number and practical problems that involve all of the above and with increasingly large positive numbers

- Add and subtract 4 digit numbers.

Art / DT

-to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials

-select from and use a wider range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks accurately

-pneumatics

- use technology safely, respectfully, and responsibly and recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour;

-identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.
